

Capture a screenshot or record streaming video with Snapz Pro

Snapz Pro is available on Macintosh workstations. It is an application that records and captures a selected area on the screen, the entire display or streaming video. It will create an image file or video file.

Snapz Pro is already turned on and operates in the background. To access Snapz Pro press **control+shift+3** (simultaneously) AFTER you display what you intend to capture.

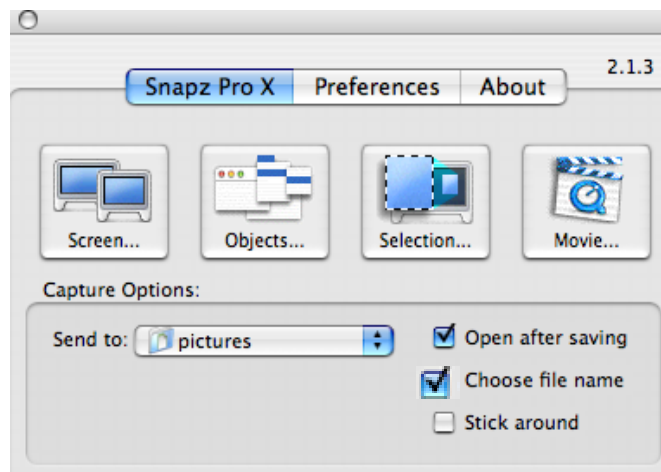
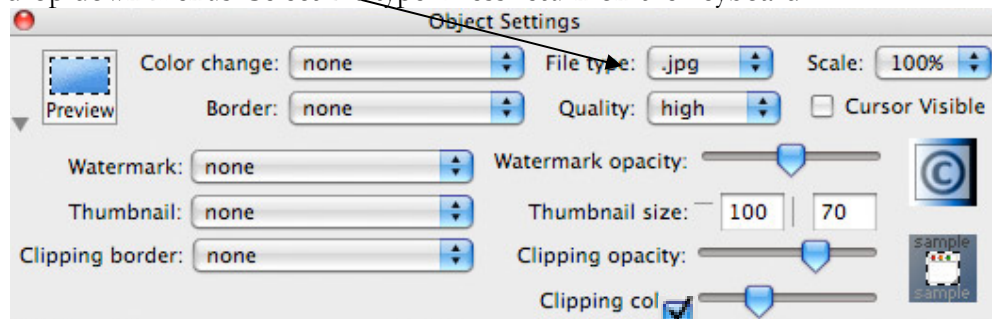


IMAGE CAPTURE

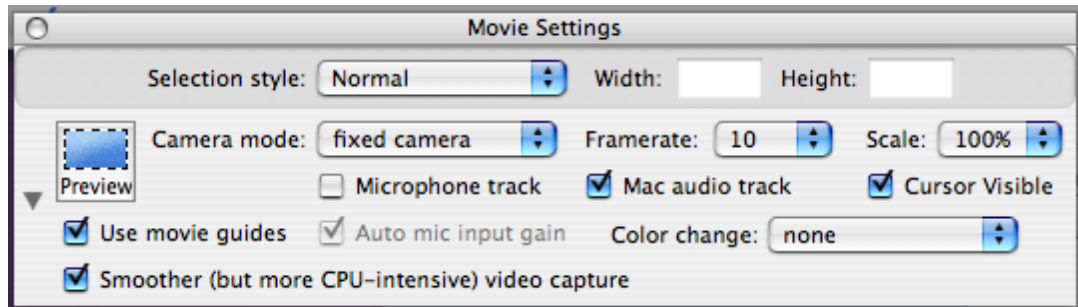
Press the **Screen** button to capture the entire display area. Use the **Objects** and **Selection...** buttons to take a snapshot of specific areas on the screen. Use the Objects button for capturing drop down menus. Select file type. Press return on the keyboard.



The image displays in Preview. Save it as a JPG, TIF (if intending to print the picture) or PDF file. Save it as a PSD file if intent is to edit in Adobe Photoshop.

VIDEO CAPTURE

To record a streaming video clip from the Web or DVD, use the **Movie** button. This is useful, for example, to capture a YouTube video clip to use in PowerPoint. Queue the movie to where you want to start recording. Press **control+shift+3** (simultaneously) and select the **Movie** button. Adjust settings as desired. Suggested settings are displayed below.



Drag the selection box over the movie screen. Press the return button on the keyboard. Give file a name, if prompted. Then play movie. When done recording press **control+shift+3** (simultaneously).



Review settings. If music is included, select Stereo under the Audio Track settings.

Press Save. The file will be saved in the Pictures folder.

QuickTime will automatically open so you can view/save your movie to a different location.

If using on Windows operating system, to play in Windows Media Player or to insert in PowerPoint, export movie as a WMV file. In QuickTime select **File > Export**. Select **Movie to Windows Media**.
